DRIVING DIRCTIONS

New Show Location

Waller Road Grange, 2708 E. 64th Street

Tacoma, Washington

From the North: From southbound I-5, take exit 135 for WA-167N/ Portland Avenue toward Puyallup. Stay to the left and turn left into the RIGHT lane onto E Bay St/E R St. Turn left onto the I-5 N ramp to Seattle and stay right to merge onto WA-167N. In 0.5 miles, take a slight right onto Pioneer Way E. In 0.8 miles turn right onto Waller Road E. Continue for 2.1 miles. Turn right onto E. 64th St and then turn left into the driveway to the Waller Road Grange.

From the South: Take Exit 135 from WA-167 from I-5 northbound. Stay in the right lane. In 0.5 miles, take a slight right onto Pioneer Way E. In 0.8 miles turn right onto Waller Road E. Continue for 2.1 miles. Turn right onto E. 64th St and then turn left into the driveway to the Waller Road Grange.

ALTERNATIVELY, from the South: Take I-5 to exit 127 and merge onto WA-512 E toward Puyallup. Continue almost 4 miles. Take the Portland Ave exit toward Midland. Turn left onto Portland Ave E. Turn right onto 104th St E. In about 1 mile, turn left onto Waller Rd E. In 2.5 miles, turn left onto E. 64th St and then turn left into the driveway of the Waller Road Grange.

- MUSEUM OF GLASS Class 301

- LEMAY - AMERICA'S CAR MUSEUM Class 302
An international destination for families and auto enthusiasts to celebrate America's love affair with the automobile and learn how it shaped our society. Use any colors incorporating an automobile in your design.
- WASHINGTON STATE HISTORY MUSEUM Class 303
History museum full of informative displays and artifacts on the history of Washington State. Use at least one dahlia originated by an originator from the state of WA.
- FOSS WATERWAY SEAPORT MUSEUM Class 304
This museum celebrates Tacoma's rich maritime heritage - past, present and future Incorporate water in your design, using at least one waterlily originated over 10 years ago.
- JOB CARR CABIN MUSEUM Class 305
This museum is a replica of Tacoma's first permanent non-native residence on land that traditionally belonged to the Puyallup people. Use red, orange, and/or bronze dahlias and incorporate wood in your design.
- POINT DEFIANCE PARK Class 306
A scenic park offering more than 700 acres of woodland trails, gardens and waterfront views along with a zoo and aquarium. Use a variety of dahlias and incorporate water in your design. Arrangements may not be wider than 24 inches, unless otherwise noted. Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of one entry per class.
